

What is Sports Premium?

The government is providing additional funding to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - will be allocated to primary school head teachers. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

How this Action Plan will work?

This action plan outlines how PE will continue to be developed at Woodmancote over the coming year. It will show how the school intends to use the Primary PE and Sports Premium money. It will map out how the funding will be used to implement CPD for teaching staff, ensuring high quality teaching for all children.

We will continue to provide wide and varied opportunities for children to participate in competitive sports, through our memberships with Cheltenham and Tewkesbury School Sport Network and the Cheltenham and District Sports Council. Furthermore, we will continue our excellent provision of sport through our clubs, ran by members of staff during lunchtimes and after school.

This is a working document and will be updated at various times in the year, and in line with the needs of children and the staff at Woodmancote.

<p>Impact</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Evaluation and Monitoring of PE indicates that the Q of T has improved in areas such as Running/Athletics, Hockey and Multi-Skills. Gymnastics has been particularly good with Year 2 children, although the school recognises that Gymnastics remains an area that staff feel less confidence generally. It has been agreed that a whole school staff Twilight session is needed for Autumn 2017. The school was one of three Gloucestershire schools nominated for the Sports Partnership Award for Upskilling Staff in 2016-17. Whilst the school did not win, this is an indication of the school's commitment to this area of development.

<p>Impact</p> <p>Cross Country - 6th and 13th October and 2nd and 9th March Attended by Paul Adkin who took 24 children. Georgia Irvine came 11th but none of our children made it to the finals. We typically had 2 or 3 children in the top 50 at each race.</p> <p>Bell Boating – Thursday 29th June Attended by Richard Hoyle and Paul Adkin who took 10 Year 5 children to the Tewkesbury Schools Festival at Tewkesbury Sailing Club on the River Avon. None of the children had ever paddled before! Sadly, the children came last overall – 22/23. The children displayed an excellent attitude and spirit but lacked technique.</p> <p>Cheltenham Half Marathon- 2nd year of involvement, but organisation was poor in 2016. However, children loved the experience and parents were incredibly supportive of our involvement.</p> <p>Monday 13th March Quick Sticks Hockey In the Cheltenham pool of schools played across 3 weeks. We won the whole tournament with our top team, which meant we qualified first for the School's Games. This made our team the top 10% of players in the county. The second team we took were placed lower but did well. 12 children took part across the 3 weeks.</p> <p>Wednesday 22nd March Tag Rugby Festival Non-competitive. Abandoned mid-day due to weather conditions</p> <p>Wednesday 3rd May Quad Kids Athletics at St Edward's School -Bronze position</p> <p>Friday 5th May Panathlon Attended by Becca Bird and George Thwaites at All Saints Academy. A good range of activities concentrating on hand eye coordination. Very well organised and enjoyed by all that attended but didn't win.</p> <p>Friday 5th June Mini Red Tennis (Year 3/4)-Children were runner up in the Cheltenham tournament and finished 6th in the County Finals at Plock Court</p>

The school also recognises that its lack of involvement in Cleeve based sporting events this year needs addressing in the next academic year.
