# Thank you

As we finally reach the end of yet another academic year, can I take this opportunity to thank parents for their continued support of the work of the school. It has been an extremely successful year, with a very good OFSTED report, super SATs results for Years 2 and 6, fantastic sporting achievements in a range of sports, the opening of our own Pre-School and several musical productions to rival those of the West End!

Our Year 4 children were wonderful on their three day trip to the Forest of Dean and the Year 6 children were a joy to take away for five days to Whitemoor Lakes.

The school has made extensive use of the various Festivals in Cheltenham and we have welcomed visitors to the school to enrich the education of every child.

Woodmancote is proud of its inclusive approach to education, its links with other organisations such as the University, Balcarras Teaching School, Cleeve and other local Primary Schools, as well as its strategic approach to managing the school site.

There have been many opportunities for the children over the year, but also a few challenges for staff and governors. A shrinking budget from central government, an inadequate social care service in Gloucestershire and an increasing number of children and families with complex needs, have all placed a burden on the school in terms of finance, time and energy. I believe that despite these challenges, Woodmancote School provides an all round education for your children, largely due to your continued support.

#### School Uniform

As we approach the end of term, thoughts turn to school uniform purchases for September. We expect parents to dress their child(ren) in uniform;

- Boys-grey trousers/school shorts; white polo shirt and a bottle green round necked sweatshirt.
- Girls-grey skirt/pinafore/trousers\*, white polo shirt and a bottle green round necked sweatshirt or cardigan sweatshirt. They may wear a green and white dress in the summer term.
- Footwear-Black/dark shoes that enclose the toes. No open toe sandals.
  - \*'Trousers' does not include leggings
- PE-Black shorts and House T-Shirt.
   Children may wear trainers for Games.

To promote House allegiance and make PE lessons more interactive, we are changing our PE kit for September 2018. Rather than a white T Shirt, we expect all children to have an appropriate shirt in their House colours. These can be bought from Schooltogs, the same place that our school sweatshirts are from.

Out attendance figures for 2017-18 have been seriously affected by an increasing number of parents taking holidays during term time. Whilst we appreciate that some holidays are cheaper at these times, term time holidays can affect a child's learning and have a negative impact upon how they view education. Please check the term dates that can be found on the school website before booking any future holidays.

65 children took a holiday of 10 sessions or more this year. Of the 65 only 13 (20%) had an attendance rate that was above 97% which is the county guidelines for attendance. 18 out of the 65 (27.6%) had an attendance rate of 96%.

7 (10.7%)of the children had an attendance rate of less than 90% which means that they missed more than 4 weeks of the school year.

If you do take your child on holiday, please do not expect staff to set homework, or ask for the work that they have missed on your return.
