

## Key Stage 1 and 2 National Curriculum Assessment Tests 2015

At the end of Key Stage 1 (Year 2) the national expectation is that children should achieve Level 2. Children achieving above expectations will be awarded Level 3 and those below, level 1. The results below stem from both assessment tests and on-going teacher assessments.

At the end of Key Stage 2 (Year 6) it is expected that children attain Level 4. Those attaining Level 5 are working well above the expected level, whilst those attaining Level 6 are working at an exceptional level for a child that age.
