Dear Parents/Carers,

**RE: End of Year Visit to the Cotswold Wildlife Park**

I am delighted to announce an end of year, whole school trip to the Cotswold Wildlife Park on Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> July. This will be an opportunity for the whole school to come together and have a great day out!

Children will be accompanied by members of staff, including teachers, teaching assistants, Midday Supervisors and staff from Woodpeckers. Little Chestnuts will also be travelling with us to the Park.

Back in 2019 we asked for voluntary parental contributions to pay for a range of activities throughout the academic year. Due to Covid, many of these activities did not occur. Therefore, we are able to significantly subsidise this trip, bringing the cost per child down from £15 to £5. This includes both the cost of the coach and entrance to the Park.

Please pay the voluntary contribution in the usual way through the ParentPay website, tick the box to give your permission and provide your emergency contact details by **Monday 7<sup>th</sup> June**. If your child is in receipt of Pupil Premium Funding, the cost of the trip will be met. All you need to do is inform the school that you give permission for your child to go on the trip. We want to make the most of the whole day, so coaches will leave the school at 9am, meaning children will need to be in school at 8.30am. We will be returning to school at approximately 5.00pm.

Children will need to wear school uniform as well as comfortable footwear and be prepared for all weather conditions (waterproof coats, sun hats and cream). The children will require a packed lunch (including a drink) in a small ruck sack that they can carry themselves.

We are looking forward to a great day out! Please do not hesitate to contact us if you have any queries.

Further details about the day will be sent nearer the time.

As with all trips, whilst this is a voluntary contribution, if the school does not receive enough contributions, the trip may not be able to go ahead. In addition, we know that many parents offer to help on such trips, but at the present time we are not looking for additional support as we have so many staff.
